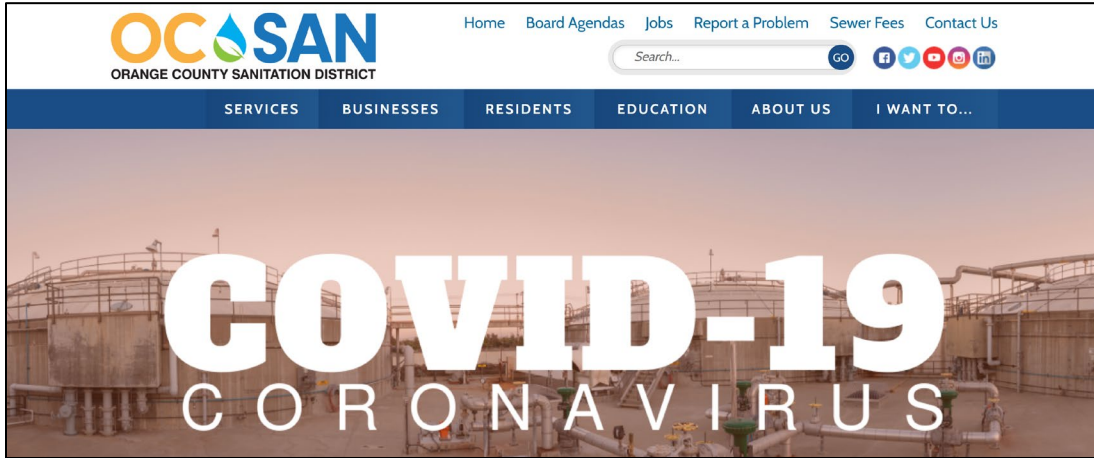

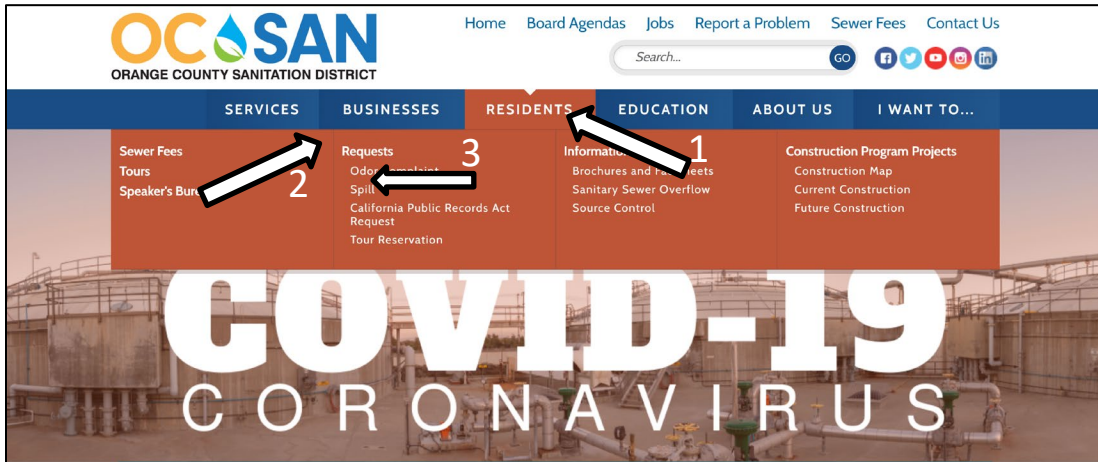

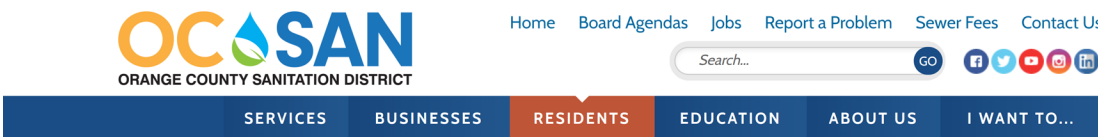

- 1 Home or Business on local sewer system**

- 2 Local Sewer System manhole overflows**
Your local sewer agency
- 3 Regional Sewer System manhole overflows**
Overflows from manholes that say OCSD on the lid are owned and maintained by Orange County Sanitation District. To report a spill call 714.593.7025 (24/7)

1 Private Sewer Laterals

Home and business owners are responsible for maintaining their sewer pipes and preventing backups and overflows.

2 Local Sewer Line

Local city or agencies are responsible for maintaining local sewer pipes in your neighborhood.

4 Storm Drain

Stormwater and urban runoff enter the municipal storm sewer system from streets, curbs and gutters and travel untreated to local water bodies of the Pacific Ocean.

3 OCSD Regional Sewer Trunkline

Orange County Sanitation District is responsible for collecting, treating and recycling wastewater on a regional level.
