



## Taft Avenue Sewer Improvement Project

Starting as early as next week, the Orange County Sanitation District (OC San) will begin potholing along North Sacramento St. as part of the **Taft Avenue Sewer Improvement Project** to support critical sewer system upgrades in the City of Orange.

This project will replace and relocate a portion of the Taft Sewer, enhancing its capacity and long-term reliability. Nearly two miles of pipeline will be upsized to improve flow capacity, better accommodate peak wet weather events, and help facilitate future maintenance.

- **Upcoming Work:** North Sacramento St. from Taft Ave. to East Brentford Ave.
- **When:** Starting week of February 10 and lasting up to 5 workdays.
- **Hours:** 8 a.m. - 5 p.m.
  - No work performed on weekends
- **Impacts:**
  - Street parking will be unavailable during work hours, but driveways will remain accessible
  - Please follow posted parking signs
  - Traffic control will be in place while work is being performed
  - Increase in activity and noise levels

The Orange County Sanitation District (OC San) is a public agency that provides regional wastewater collection, treatment, and recycling services for approximately 2.6 million people in central and northwest Orange County. OC San operates two facilities, 15 pump stations, almost 400 miles of regional sewer pipes, and treats more than 190 million gallons of wastewater each day.
