



Cypress Trunk Sewer Project

Heads up—crews and cones are heading your way!

Over the past six months, Orange County Sanitation District (OC San) crews have been working in the cities of La Palma and Cypress as part of the Cypress Trunk Sewer Project to make improvements to the regional sewer line. Later this month, they'll be working their way into the City of Los Alamitos. Preparation work will start with daytime inspections, followed by nighttime cleaning and grouting during low flow in the pipes. Think of this work as us doing our homework to prepare for the test—it helps ensure that when we return later for manhole rehabilitation, the process goes smoothly and efficiently.

Location: Along the project route in the City of Los Alamitos (see map). Visit ocsan.gov/cypress for specific locations.

When: Anticipated to start in Los Alamitos late November 2025*

Hours:

- Daytime: Mon. - Fri.
 - 8:30 a.m. - 4:30 p.m.
- Nighttime: Sun. - Fri.
 - 8:00 p.m. - 6:00 a.m.

What to Expect:

- Reduced lanes near the work area.
- Temporary traffic control while work is being performed.
- Increased activity, dust, and noise levels.

The Project

The Cypress Trunk Sewer Project is enhancing 7 miles of regional sewer through various streets in the cities of Cypress, La Palma, and Los Alamitos. A mile of pipe will be replaced with a larger diameter pipe to increase the capacity, approximately 5.5 miles of pipe will be cleaned and injected with chemical grout to lengthen its service life, and approximately 100 manholes will also be replaced and/or rehabilitated.

The Need

The Cypress Trunk Sewer Project will ensure the continued reliability of the regional sewer system. The regional sewer line in the cities of Cypress, Los Alamitos, and La Palma is approximately 50 years old and in need of upgrades. These repairs will increase sewer capacity and allow for more efficient and reliable management while extending the life of the sewer pipes for decades to come.
